POLICE

Council specifies that police officers are responsible for calling the Public Works

Department when the roads are icy or snow covered.

RECREATION, TOURISM AND CULTURE

Past and future activities at the CEPSC are mentioned.

The Department is closing the 2014 tourist season and preparing for 2015.

The RTC is working on new tourism signs.

The Caroline Savoie concert, offered by the Société culturelle régionale Les Chutes, was moved to November 22nd at 7:30 p.m.

PLANNING

A total of 29 permits with a total value of \$290,517 were given in October.

No subdivision or other was discussed.

The Town has finalized arrangements to offer its own land planning service.

Hiring

2014-078 That Éric Gagnon is hired as Municipal Planning Officer / GIS Specialist for the Grand Falls Land Use Planning Department with salary and benefits as negotiated. Carried

2014-079 That Cyr Lebel is hired as Building Inspector for the Grand Falls Land Use Planning Department with salary and benefits as negotiated. Carried

Mayor Keeley explains the procedure to hire these employees and the circumstances that led the Town to offer its own services. He specifies that in 2015 Grand Falls would have paid \$265,000 of the \$1,000,000 RSC budget for land use planning. Grand Falls remains open to meet the Province to discuss revisions to the contribution formula.

He explains that Mr. Gagnon and Mr. Lebel were appointed without a public job posting as they already work for Grand Falls, under contract with the RSC. They have the expertise and the seniority necessary to fill the vacancies.

726, 4th Avenue

ENVIRONMENT

The lights in the middle of the Broadway Boulevard will be changed to LED before the end of March 2015. This work follows our Green Plan initiatives and will settle the lack of electrical power in that location.

Thanks to the Public Works Department who has installed fences along the Tobique Road and Main Street to protect the new trees that were planted there this year.
