#### **PLANNING**

In July, 27 permits were given by the Planning Department and four variances were accepted by the Planning Advisory Committee.

Councillor Ouellette mentions that there will be no charge for building permits in the future. However, if owners fail to obtain a permit before beginning the construction, the cost will be \$25 + \$10 per \$1,000 of the evaluation, double the cost in the by-law today.

The ice at the CEPSC will be ready on September 6<sup>th</sup>.

Minor baseball had a record year for registrations in 2016.

22,107 tourists visited the Malabeam and LaRochelle centers. The season has been very busy.

An Elvis impersonator will be performing at the CEPSC on August 27<sup>th</sup>.

The golf employees are doing exceptional work. The course remains beautiful and well maintained.

#### ADMINISTRATION / HUMAN RESOURCES

Councillor Long acknowledges the employees working out in the heat these days.

He notes that the Town presently employs 48 seasonal workers. There are currently five employees on sick leave and one on leave because of an accident at work.

Three job offers will be posted, one for an operator, another for a casual police officer and the third for a deputy chief of police.

#### **POLICE**

A police operation took place at the Madawaska Road and Turcotte bridge intersection during which 37 drivers were caught passing on a red light.

#### **LIBRARY**

A new director will be on the job in September or October.

The library will organise a "Chase the Ace" fundraiser soon. Volunteers are requested.

#### COUNCIL INTERVENTION

#### Reforestation program

Councillor Rino Long notes the increase in the program from \$200 to \$400.

#### MEDIA INTERVENTION

The press questions Council's directive to firefighters when they are called by Ambulance NB for lift assist. Mayor Deschênes explains the law which requires that firefighters answer only to calls for which they have been trained. Firefighters are not insured when they answer to incidents for which they have no training. Council is working on this situation that exists everywhere in the province.

Council is asked about the possibility of a dog park. Mayor Deschênes mentions that Daniel Martin has discussed this with him. There will be a park but the location remains to be determined.

The media questions if Pit Bulls are still prohibited in town. The CAO confirms that they are. The subject will be brought to Council for discussion.

Council confirms that William, Vanier, Veteran and Leclerc streets will be paved this year. The Province will pave Tobique and Portage roads.
