Mayor Keeley explains that the number of councillors will reflect the provincial norm. Because of the current economy, Council faces decisions that are often difficult. The number of committees on which Council is represented will be revised in order to lighten each councillor's responsibility.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 2013 financial audit

The 2013 financial report is presented by Réal Nadeau of Nadeau Picard and Associates. A consolidated surplus of \$23,773 was realised excluding grants and donations. The debt is at 14.8 million (31%) and there is a total of 2.6 million in reserve funds.
